ATL Proposed Changes to Grant Formula Funds

A discussion was held regarding ATL taking over the distribution of Grant Formula Funds - i.e., 5307 and 5337 Funds. ATL has a proposal on the table to withhold a $\frac{1}{2}$ to 1% fee to be used for regional purposes - i.e., those things that cut across multiple boundaries. Meetings are being held to receive input on policy changes.

The Board of Directors received a briefing on the Gwinnett County transit referendum. Items covered were:

<u>Summary of 2019 State Legislative Session</u>

MARTA's Legislative Priorities included:

- Bond Transaction Flexibility would allow MARTA to execute bond resolutions with prior Board approval. This would allow more flexibility to access bond market on days other than when Board meets and approves deals
- Restore Motor Fuel Tax Exception (eliminated by HB170) this also affects other transit systems
- Disposition of MARTA Assets Below \$25K Board approval is now required for all asset sales. This offers more flexibility particularly in the area of sale of small real estate holdings
- No-fare Policies for uniformed off-duty police officers and other law enforcement officials in an effort to encourage such individuals to ride transit
- MARTA Autonomy with any changes to HB 930, preserve MARTA's autonomy consistent with the Transit Governance Principles adopted by the Board in 2018
